Office overview sessions will provide participants with a unique perspective into the environmental enforcement and compliance assurance world and each office's role and responsibilities in supporting EPA's mission.

Breakout Session Descriptions and Panelists

Scientists/Engineers - Scientists, technologists and engineers perform cutting-edge research that can help make this a cleaner, more sustainable planet. This session provides a glimpse into the work performed by those working in a laboratory environment, in the field as well as those that support policy development and case work. Legal - Our attorneys work on cutting-edge legal issues, are given extraordinary responsibility even at an early stage in their careers and are recognized as legal experts. Criminal Investigators/Law Enforcement Officers – OECA's Office of Criminal Enforcement Forensics and Training (OCEFT) is the only federal law enforcement entity dedicated to pursuing criminal violators of the environmental laws and associated violations of the criminal code. Those interested in a career focused on developing criminal cases against individuals and corporations that violate environmental and associated laws should attend this session. Program and Data Analysts – People interested in working with data, but not necessarily IT programming, will find this session interesting. Mission Operations and Support – This session will focus on career opportunities responsible for ensuring that OECA operates efficiently and has the tools necessary to carry out its mission. OECA Offices

FFEO – The Federal Facilities Enforcement Office (FFEO) is responsible for ensuring that Federal facilities take all necessary actions to prevent, control and abate environmental pollution. Learn more about FFEO's work in this overview session.

OAP – The Office of Administration and Policy provides OECA with a wide range of management policy as well as administrative leadership and support including: Congressional and legislative review and regulatory coordination; Human resources services; Labor relations; Budget formulation and execution; Records management; Information technology security and management. Learn more about OAP's work in this overview session.

OC – The Office of Compliance's (OC) mission is to provide and improve the infrastructure for EPA, states and tribes to ensure compliance with our national environmental laws. Learn more about the tools OC uses to accomplish its mission in this session.

OCE – The Office of Civil Enforcement (OCE) develops and prosecutes administrative and civil judicial cases and provides legal support for cases and investigations initiated in EPA regions. OCE also has responsibility for planning and setting priorities for enforcement activities, developing national enforcement policy and guidance, participating in Agency rule-making to ensure that regulations contain clear and enforceable provisions, and implementing effective communication to alert regulated entities to potential non-compliance problems. OCEFT -The Office of Criminal Enforcement, Forensics and Training (OCEFT) is staffed with law enforcement officers, scientists, engineers, attorneys and support staff. OCEFT investigates environmental crimes using specialized investigative and forensic techniques. OCEFT focuses on the most egregious cases against both individuals and corporations who violate environmental and associated statutes. In this overview session, learn more about OCEFT and its unique law enforcement role.

OSRE – The Office Site Remediation and Enforcement (OSRE) manages the enforcement of EPA's national cleanup programs implemented through EPA's HQ and regional offices and RCRA state programs. OSRE's mission is to protect human health and the environment by ensuring that responsible parties clean up hazardous waste sites and respond to oil spills.
