## Projects that Reduce Residential Wood Smoke Emissions

**Description:** Butte County, CA, designated nonattainment for the 2006 24-hr PM2.5 NAAQS, was able to reach attainment through a combination of wood-burning device change outs, curtailment programs, outreach, and rulemaking.

	<ul> <li>It's helpful to balance the volume of change outs (to maximize emission reductions) with opportunities to fund change outs for low-income households (some households / neighborhoods won't see emission reductions without larger voucher incentive amounts).</li> <li>Having a PM monitor capable of speciation was helpful, as it showed that wood-smoke was responsible for nonattainment and reduced concentrations of wood-smoke helped lead to attainment.</li> </ul>
