

The Office of Inspector General for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency plans to begin reviewing prior single audit reports to identify lessons related to the administration of infrastructure programs. This project addresses the following fiscal year 2022 [top management challenge](#) for the Agency: managing infrastructure funding and business operations.

Our objective is to highlight findings identified in single audit reports that are relevant to the EPA's administration of programs under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. This project does not constitute an audit or evaluation but is intended to comprise a review of documentation from prior OIG reports and a summary of our findings. Therefore, this work will not be conducted in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards or with the *Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation*, issued by the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency. We will, however, follow the OIG's quality control procedures to ensure that the information in the report is accurate and supported. The anticipated benefit of this review is enhanced oversight of grants under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.
