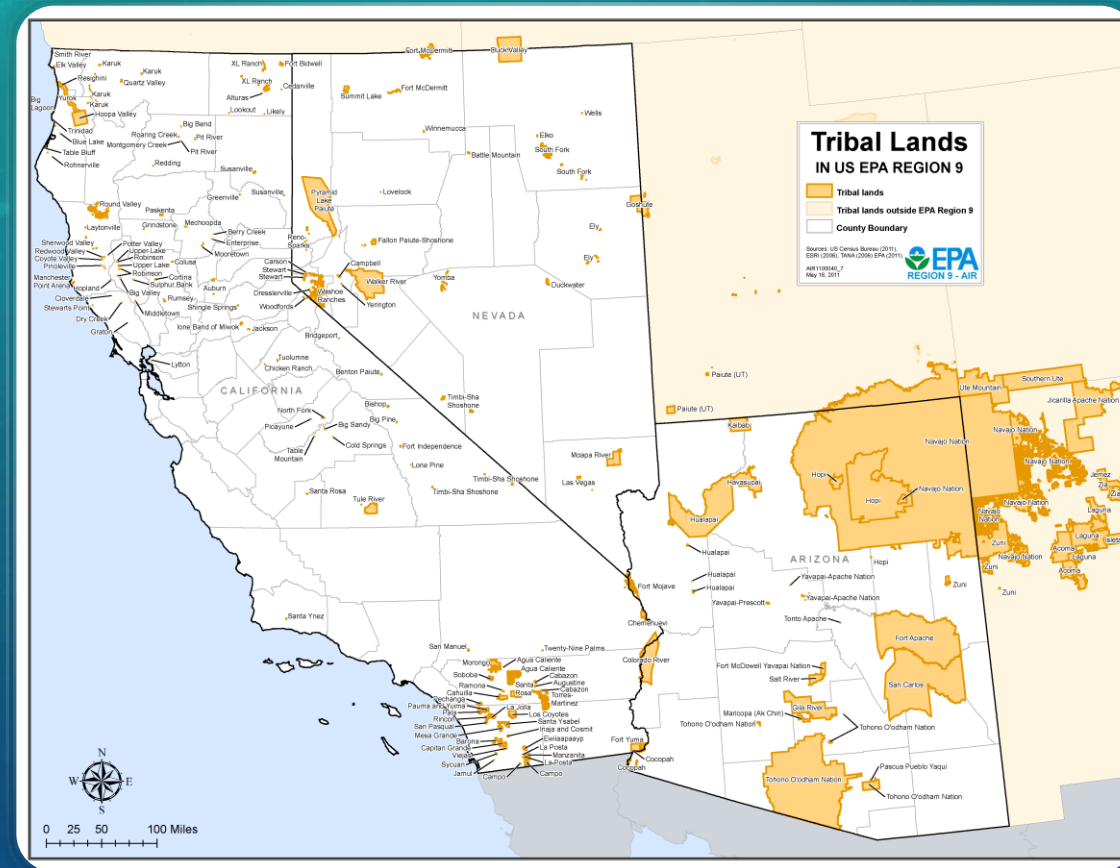


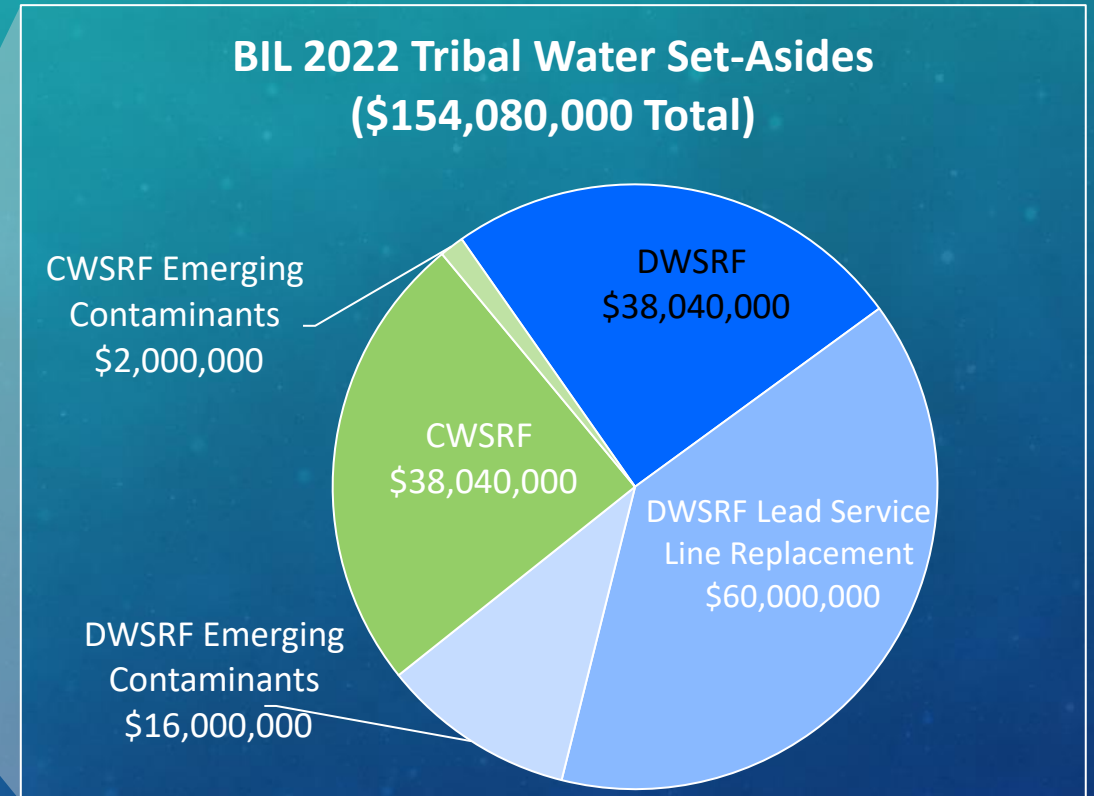
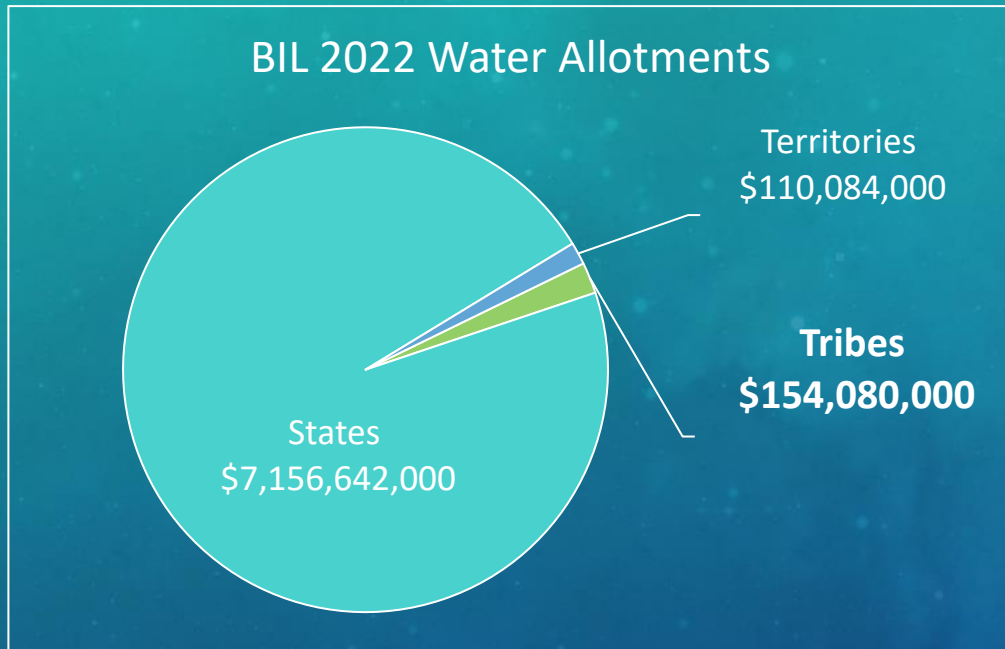

## REGION 9 IMPLEMENTATION OF BIL FUNDING

- DWTSAs and CWISAs BIL Supplements
  - Anticipate using existing processes
    - Project solicitation for drinking water projects
    - SDS list for wastewater projects
- Lead Service Lines and Emerging Contaminants
  - Additional implementation guidance is forthcoming
  - R9 reviewing existing project proposals with these new funding authorities in mind

# BIL IMPLEMENTATION - EMERGING CONTAMINANTS

- **Clean Water** – Considering primary categories to be eligible for funding
  - PFAS/POPs, biological contaminants and microorganisms, PPCPs, nanomaterials, microplastics/nanoplastics
- **Drinking Water** – Contaminant Candidate Lists (CCL) identify priority contaminants for future regulation
  - Projects addressing PFAS will be prioritized
  - Projects addressing contaminants listed on CCL1-CCL5 will also be eligible

## BIL IMPLEMENTATION - LEAD SERVICE LINES

- Planning and design for LSLR infrastructure projects.
- Developing or updating lead service line inventories, including locating and mapping lead service lines.
- Providing technical assistance to small water systems undertaking lead service line inventories or construction projects.
- Funding state staff and contractors to work on LSLR education and outreach and inventory plans, etc.
- Non-routine lead sampling (if not for compliance purposes).
