## **DECISION MEMORANDUM**

**SUBJECT:** Project Waiver of American Iron and Steel Requirements to the

Contentnea Metropolitan Sewer District (CMSD) in Grifton, North

Carolina for 14-inch Check Valves

<u>Decision</u>: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is hereby granting a project waiver pursuant to the "American Iron and Steel" (AIS) requirements of the Clean Water Act Section 608 under the authority of Section 608(c)(2) to the Contentnea Metropolitan Sewer District (CMSD) in Grifton, North Carolina (Applicant) for 14-inch check valves. This waiver permits the use of these check valves, manufactured outside of the United States, in the North Carolina Highway 11 Pump Station Improvements Project, because no domestic manufacturers produce alternatives that meet the technical specifications of the project.

This waiver applies only to the proposed project funded by the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF). Any other entity with projects funded by either the CWSRF, the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund, or the Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act that wishes to use the same products must apply for a separate waiver.

<u>Rationale</u>: Section 608 of the Clean Water Act requires CWSRF assistance recipients for treatment works projects to use specific iron and steel products that are produced in the United States. EPA has the authority to determine whether it is necessary to waive this requirement based on certain circumstances set forth in Section 608(c) of the Clean Water Act. The provision states that, "[the requirements] shall not apply in any case or category of cases in which the Administrator [of EPA] finds that  $-\dots$  (2) iron and steel products are not produced in the United States in sufficient and reasonably available quantities and of a satisfactory quality."

<u>Background of Waiver Request</u>: The Applicant provided information to EPA asserting that there are no domestic manufacturers producing 14-inch check valves in sufficient and

reasonably available quantities and of a satisfactory quality. These flanged lever & weight check valves with limit switches are needed to move the sewer pump station from the flood plain out of the flood zone.

Assessment of Waiver Request: EPA conducted market research and a public comment period on the supply and availability of these check valves. The basis of evaluation included thorough review of the waiver request submission, examination of domestic manufacturer catalogs or other technical data and marketing materials, personal communication with domestic manufacturers, inquiries of state staff, and outreach to contractors and engineers with expertise and familiarity with the project. During market research, EPA contacted ten (10) potential manufacturers and suppliers of these check valves. None of the manufacturers stated they could make the AIS-compliant check valves. EPA received no (zero) public comments to the waiver request.

<u>Finding</u>: Since the Applicant established a proper basis to specify the products required for this project, and because EPA substantiated the Applicant's claim through market research that these products are not available from a manufacturer in the United States, the Contentnea Metropolitan Sewer District (CMSD) in Grifton, North Carolina is hereby granted a waiver from the AIS requirements. This waiver permits the purchase of the specified check valves, as documented in the Applicant's waiver request submittal, dated May 16, 2022
