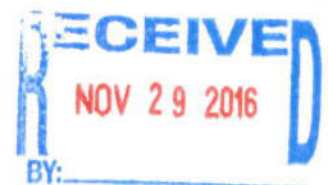

**Complaint :** For several months a car painting facility which moved within 20 feet of our house has been emitting fumes into the air which have making me sicker. I called the Frankfort KY EPA office and gave the report. I was told that it would be assigned to an investigator and I would hear back. I did not hear anything and the fumes continued. I called back to Frankfort and was told the name of the investigator of David Shivel and my report number. They gave me the phone number for the London KY Office and said to call there because he had not made any notes. I called the number and spoke with Mr. Shivel. I told him I had a video of the fumes that I would like him to view. He gave me his email address and I sent the video url because the file was too large to email. <http://www.gracemoore.net/paint.mp4> I asked if he would call me and let me know if he could view the video ok and if not we could make arrangements for some other option. I received no call back. I followed up with a couple of emails and still no response to the emails. In those, I just asked, please let me know if you can view the video and what are the steps going forward. Still nothing. I called again to the office and spoke to someone else since Mr. Shivel was unavailable. I explained the situation and asked the person on the phone if they would go to the url and see if the video was viewable. He did and said it was and he would have David call me. Mr. Shivel never returned the call. We took another video a couple of weeks later and I again called the London Office. Mr. Shivel did not want to come out he said. I said I was going to call the Frankfort Office back because I needed the fumes to stop. I told him of my **Prova** issues and how difficult it would be to have to leave the house and stay with someone else. Later that day, an hour and a half or so, I was viewing the 2nd video on my computer and Mr. Shivel came to the door. There was a lady with him but she was not identified. My husband answered the door and asked them to come in that I wanted to speak with them and show them the video and because of **Prova** issues I could not come out there. They came inside but after a minute or so and Mr. Shivel raising his voice in an angry manner, the lady said "I'm going outside" and Mr. Shivel said, "She's allergic to dogs." We have one pug in our home who was at the door before they ever entered. I replied, "I have not been able to file my complaint and offer the evidence I have and I would like to do that." Mr. Shivel said, "it's not pain" and walked out the door. I was given no alternate way to send the video and no one has still viewed it or taken my report. I requested records through pen Records and was sent only a few but nothing from Jan and February. I then was sent Mr. Shivel's report which had dates that did not match in his notice/report and testing. I kept emailing and asking why and was given a "few more records found by a colleague" I was told by Open Records clerk. I still have not received them all and feel they have been falsified because I wasn't able to go outside when she was allergic to dogs and they provided no reasonable accommodation to take my report, evidence that the office has been discriminatory. The Open Records requestis have not been honored and many conflicting pieces of information come to me even though I requested "any and all" in my records request initially. The fumes are making my health worse and my health already is not well. It is discriminatory I think to not take my complaint and look at my information of what is going on because I could not go outside. Mr. Shivel did not state he was allergic to dogs, only that she was.

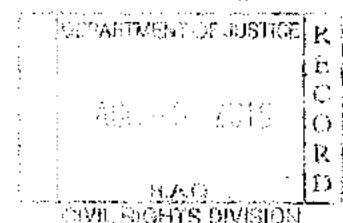

ADA Complaint

The Incident Description Reports that were provided to you as part of your Open Records Request listed that the initial complaint filed on March 24, 2016, was from an anonymous caller. It also listed a complaint that was called in on April 12, 2016, where the caller was again identified as anonymous. On April 21, 2016, and May 3, 2016, a complaint was called in that referenced (b) (6) Privacy as a private citizen who was reporting fumes (paint or otherwise) escaping on (b) (6) Privacy.

The information on the Incident Description Reports shows the date and time that the investigation started. Our departmental data base shows the start time and date for an investigation and the end time and date for an investigation. Those records indicate an odor survey was performed at the facility adjacent to your residence on April 12, 2016, and there was no violation found. Supporting documentation also shows a visit to the facility was done on April 13, 2016. During that timeframe the inspector witnessed painting being done at the facility and documented that no violations were found. A letter was sent to the facility on April 18, 2016, indicating there were no violations found during the inspection that was conducted on April 13, 2016.

As a citizen of the Commonwealth we value your input and your diligence in reporting incidents that you feel may be in violation of air quality regulations. However, in this incident there have been no documented violations of air quality regulations.

Any future reports will continue to be handled and addressed in accordance with Departmental Business Rules and Standard Operating Procedures for Complaints.

Dear (b) (6) Privacy:

On May 24, 2016, I spoke to you regarding an American's with Disabilities (ADA) complaint if you had previously made to Sherry Butler, Energy and Environment Cabinet BEO Coordinator. The Department for Environmental Protection has reviewed the matter and there does not appear to be an ADA violation.

In reference to the ADA complaint you stated that you made a complaint to the Division for Air Quality on April 20, 2016, regarding an odor from an auto body paint shop located next to your residence. On that day, David Shival and Laura Spoles came to your residence in response to the complaint. Due to this fact, you wanted them to view a video and you told them you had (b) (6) Privacy issues they entered your home.

There is a verbal policy within the agency that an inspector is not to enter a private residence when responding to a complaint. Even though they are not required to do so Mr. Shival and Ms. Spoles entered your residence. While the inspectors didn't watch the video in its entirety they had watched a previous video that you had sent to the Department for Environmental Protection, London Regional Office. In reference to that video, the inspectors advised to you that they can't quantify emissions from viewing a video and the response to your question as to whether or not another video was provided.

The inspectors did visit the facility and do an odor survey and witnessed what takes place when a vehicle is being painted. You indicated that you thought the inspector should come into your backyard and measure on survey to determine what was coming from the body shop. It is a documented standard protocol that they measure on both full and/or do odor surveys at the property line of the facility. If the paint shop is located on the property line, then the measurements outside of the property line are not considered a reasonable way to measure odors. It is possible that the inspectors are not
