**RE: Rejection and Referral of Administrative Complaint**

Dear Commander Farris:

This letter relates to the referenced administrative complaint which U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Office of External Civil Rights Compliance (OECRC) received on November 8, 2022. The complaint alleges that conditions and practices at the Caddo Correctional Center D/SEG (Caddo) in Shreveport, Louisiana violate individuals' rights under the First, Fourth, Sixth, Eighth, Tenth, and Fourteenth Amendments of the United States' Constitution.

After careful review, OECRC has determined that OECRC is rejecting the complaint for investigation because it does not meet the jurisdictional requirements described in the EPA's nondiscrimination regulation. However, OECRC is referring the complaint to the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ).

Pursuant to EPA's nondiscrimination regulation, OECRC conducts a preliminary review of administrative complaints to determine acceptance, rejection, or referral to the appropriate Federal agency. *See* 40 C.F.R. § 7.120(d)(1). To be accepted for investigation, a complaint must meet the jurisdictional requirements described in the EPA's nondiscrimination regulation. First, the complaint must be in writing. *See* 40 C.F.R. § 7.120(b)(1). Second, it must describe an alleged discriminatory act that, if true, may violate the EPA's nondiscrimination regulation (i.e., an alleged discriminatory act based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability). *Id.* Third, it must be filed within 180 days of the alleged discriminatory act. *See* 40 C.F.R. § 7.120(b)(2). Finally, the complaint must be filed against an applicant for, or recipient of, EPA financial assistance that allegedly committed the discriminatory act. *See* 40 C.F.R. § 7.15.

The correspondence does not meet the jurisdictional requirements of the EPA's nondiscrimination regulation at 40 C.F.R Part 7. Specifically, Caddo is not a recipient of EPA financial assistance, and the constitutional violations alleged are beyond OECRC's jurisdictional authorities. As a result, the OECRC must reject the complaint and close this case as of the date of this letter.


