The Alliance brings together communities, companies, and conservationists to improve our lands and waters.



SPRING CARE TIPS



TAKING CARE OF

Cut back any dead parts of perennial plants and grasses that remain from winter, to a height of 4-6 inches and dispose of cut vegetation. Leave all new growth and green basal* leaves of plants such as Black-eyed Susans, Asters and Penstemons.

*Bosal leaves grow in a tight cluster or rosette at the base of a plant.

LEAVE DORMANT

Prune shrubs to remove dead or diseased branches. Native shrubs and trees should never be sheared or shaped. Check out our Pruning Guide for more instructions on pruning.



START REGULAR

Start hand weeding now when you see new growth, and at least twice monthly by the end of April through June. Be sure to dig up the roots of any weeds as many weeds can grow back even from small root chuncks.

Make bringing a reusable mug and water bottle with you a daily practice.


Keep reusable bags in your car to utilize whenever you are out shopping.

REGIONAL OPPORTUNITY - ENGAGING 19M+ PEOPLE




The Alliance offers paid internships for Bowie State University students in order to diversify the pipeline of professionals into the environmental field.




