Re: Acknowledgement, Rejection and Referral of Administrative Complaint

Dear (b)(6) Privacy, (b)(7)(C) Enf. Privacy

This letter is to notify you that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Office of Environmental Justice & External Civil Rights Compliance, Office of External Civil Rights Compliance (OECRC) received your correspondence on June 27, 2023, requesting assistance in acquiring certification in Heating, Ventilation, Air Condition (HVAC, specifically Section 608 certification and R-410A certification, HVAC refrigeration certification.

OECRC is responsible for processing complaints alleging that applicants for or recipients of EPA financial assistance have discriminated against individuals or communities under the federal nondiscrimination laws, including Title VI and EPA's nondiscrimination regulations found at 40 C.F.R. Parts 5 and 7. In addition, EPA's nondiscrimination regulations prohibit discrimination based, in part, on a person having exercised rights protected by Title VI. For the reasons described below, OECRC cannot accept this correspondence as a complaint for investigation. Accordingly, this matter is closed as of the date of this letter.

Pursuant to EPA's nondiscrimination regulation, OECRC conducts a preliminary review of administrative complaints to determine acceptance, rejection, or referral to the appropriate Federal agency. See 40 C.F.R. § 7.120(d)(1). To be accepted for investigation, a complaint must meet the jurisdictional requirements described in the EPA's nondiscrimination regulation. First, the complaint must be in writing. See 40 C.F.R. § 7.120(b)(1). Second, it must describe an alleged discriminatory act that, if true, may violate the EPA's nondiscrimination regulation (i.e., an alleged discriminatory act based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability). Id. Third, it must be filed within 180 days of the alleged discriminatory act. See 40 C.F.R. § 7.120(b)(2). Finally, the complaint must be filed against an applicant for, or recipient of, EPA financial assistance that allegedly committed the discriminatory act. See 40 C.F.R. § 7.15.

Your correspondence does not meet the jurisdictional requirements of the EPA's nondiscrimination regulation at 40 CFR Part 7. Specifically, although your letter is a writing, it does not: 1) describe an act or omission that, if true, may violate Title VI or EPA's nondiscrimination regulation; 2) provide the date of the alleged discriminatory act for OECRC to determine whether the action or omission occurred with 180 days of your filing the complaint; and 3) describe a recipient of EPA financial assistance that is alleged responsible for the claimed discrimination. As a result, the OECRC must reject your complaint and close this case as of the

date of this letter.
