Overview of New York's Planned Activities

New York seeks to improve data management and processes for solid waste and recycling data collection. New York will accomplish this goal by improving its data systems, which will enhance the speed and efficiency of the state's data management processes. The state will identify data gaps and target those gaps for future data collection improvements. In addition, New York will draft user guidance, seek feedback, and revise data processing procedures to improve the usability of its systems. Revision of the data processing procedures will make the data available to the public in a more timely, widely available manner.

SWIFR Grants for States and Territories

The Save Our Seas 2.0 Act provides investments in recycling to support the implementation of the National Recycling Strategy and build a circular economy for all. This funding supports improvements to waste management systems and programs, allowing for more efficient resource use and less environmental impact from waste materials. The SWIFR grant funding can be used to develop or update plans to advance post-consumer materials management, implement those plans, and improve data collection efforts.
