The discharge from this facility is located County Road 7575, 3 miles east of Highway 550/County Road 7575, San Juan County, New Mexico. Under the SIC code 4941, the applicant operates Cutter Lateral Water Treatment Plant (CLWTP), which potentially discharges an average flow of 0.12 MGD. Potential discharge is to Blanco Wash, a tributary of Canon Largo, thence to San Juan River. Designated uses of the receiving water are stated in the fact sheet.

This is a renewal of a permit issued on November 30, 2018, with an effective date of December 30, 2018, and an expiration date of December 29, 2023.

Changes from the previous permit are:

- Mass limitation for TSS has been removed.
- Limits for copper have been added.
- Monitoring for hardness has been added.
- Monitoring frequency for TSS has been changed to "Daily" from "Weekly".
