

Re: 105 Air Pollution Control Program Plan Cooperative Agreement Number A005236-84-NSPS Delegation of Authority Request

Dear Mr. Adamkus:

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency hereby automatically requests delegation of authority to enforce the NSPS requirements promulgated in 40 CFR Part 60 and the NESHAPS requirements promulgated in 40 CFR Part 61 for all sources located in or to be located in the State. This delegation includes future standards promulgated for additional pollutants and source categories and revisions and amendments to existing and future standards.

However, if the State determines that for some reason, including budget and staff constraints, that it is unable to administer any additions to the NSPS or NESHAPS programs, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency will notify the Regional Administrator of the State's intent to turn back the delegation and the reasons for the change in approach. Upon such notification by the State, the primary enforcement will return to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
