In accordance with § 800.14(b)(ii), EPA hereby provides public notice and welcomes public comment on a draft programmatic agreement (PA) developed to govern compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act for implementation of the following: EPA administration of water infrastructure financing programs, including the Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) Grant Program, with funds appropriated and authorized each year through the Federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, passed by the United States Congress and signed by the President of the United States; and New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) administration of certain water infrastructure financing programs, including the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF), Drinking Water State Revolving Funds (DWSRF) with funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), under RSA 486:14, Section 1452 of the Safe Drinking Water Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 300j-12 and 33 U.S.C 1384, and 40 CFR Part 35 Subpart L and 40 CFR Part 35 Subpart K, or other related federal legislation as amended from time to time, such as the Water Infrastructure for the Nation Act (WIIN) and the Sewer Overflow and Stormwater Reuse Municipal Grants (OSG) Program, and the Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Fund (DWGTF), PFAS Remediation Loan and Grant Fund (PFAS RLF), and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
