Re: Resolution of Administrative Complaint No. 01RNO-22-R9

Dear Director DiBiase:

This letter is to inform you that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Office of External Civil Rights Compliance (OECRC) is resolving this complaint based on the enclosed Informal Resolution Agreement (Agreement) entered into between EPA and the Pima County Department of Environmental Quality (PDEQ). On August 16, 2022, OECRC accepted for investigation an administrative complaint brought under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and EPA's implementing regulations at 40 C.F.R. Part 7, which alleged discrimination on the basis of race and national origin. Specifically, the issues accepted for investigation were:

- 1. Whether PDEQ's criteria and method of administering its air quality permitting process for the proposed Becton, Dickinson and Company (Becton) Product Sterilization Facility, specifically, with respect to the method used by PDEQ for its environmental justice analysis, subjected persons of color, including Latinx persons, who live "near" the Becton Facility to discrimination on the basis of race and national origin in violation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and EPA's implementing regulation at 40 C.F.R. Part 7;<sup>1</sup>
- Whether PDEQ discriminated on the basis of race and national origin, in violation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and EPA's implementing regulation at 40 C.F.R. Part 7, by failing to provide meaningful public participation in the air permit process for the proposed Becton Facility; and
- 3. Whether PDEQ has and is implementing the procedural safeguards required under 40 C.F.R. Parts 5 and 7 that all recipients of federal assistance must have in place to comply with their general nondiscrimination obligations, including specific policies and procedures to ensure meaningful access to PDEQ services, programs, and activities, for individuals with limited

English proficiency (LEP) and individuals with disabilities, and whether PDEQ has a public participation policy and process that is consistent with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 including other federal civil rights laws, and EPA's implementing regulations at 40 C.F.R. Parts 5 and 7.

During EPA's investigation, PDEQ agreed to enter into the Agreement in order the resolve the complaint. The enclosed Agreement is entered into by EPA pursuant to its authority under the federal nondiscrimination laws, including Title VI and EPA's nondiscrimination regulations at 40 C.F.R. Parts 5 and 7. The Agreement resolves EPA Complaint No. 01RNO-22-R9. The Agreement does not constitute an admission by PDEQ of any violation or a finding by EPA of compliance or noncompliance with applicable federal civil rights laws, including Title VI and 40 C.F.R. Parts 5 and 7.

The enclosed Agreement does not affect PDEQ's continuing responsibilities under Title VI or 40 C.F.R. Parts 5 and 7, and other federal non-discrimination laws and regulation, nor does it affect EPA's investigation of any Title VI or other federal civil rights complaints or address any other matter not covered by the Agreement. This letter sets forth EPA's disposition of EPA Complaint No. 01RNO-22-R9. This letter is not a formal statement of EPA policy and should not be relied upon, cited, or construed as such.

EPA appreciates the cooperation of your staff, especially Abigail Okrent, in resolving this matter. EPA is committed to working with PDEQ as it implements the provisions of the Agreement.
