HEATING SYSTEM ADVISORY



As temperatures drop, you may be tempted to restart your heating oil system. Before you do, follow these steps to ensure your safety.

ENSURE SAFETY

Ensure the tanks do not have holes in them before filling with heating oil. Visually inspect for pinholes or weeping. If a leak is observed and there is fuel already in the tank, the delivery personnel should remove the oil from the tank.

*If your tank has dislodged, do not attempt to retrieve the tank yourself. The potential for fuel leaks poses a significant safety risk.

CONTACT EMERGENCY SERVICES

Call your local emergency services to inform them about the situation and request assistance in securing the area if necessary.

CONTACT HEATING OIL COMPANY

Reach out to your oil supplier immediately to report the issue and to have your system inspected by a trained professional.

ARRANGE FOR TANK REMOVAL OR REPLACEMENT

Your oil company will likely arrange for a qualified professional to retrieve the tank and assess any potential environmental damage. A new tank may need to be installed depending on the condition of the old one.

FOLLOW LOCAL REGULATIONS: Depending on your location, there may be specific regulations regarding handling and reporting oil spills.

INSURANCE COVERAGE: Check with your insurance provider to understand what coverage you may have for a situation like this.
