

RFP from the City of Lee's Summit, MO for LFG Energy Project



As a service to our Partners and other interested parties, EPA's Landfill Methane Outreach Program (LMOP) is sharing information about a **request for proposals (RFP)** from the **City of Lee's Summit, Missouri**. Please note that EPA is not affiliated in any way with the review and selection process. Information provided is based on the RFP.

The City of Lee's Summit is soliciting qualifications and proposals for the **development (i.e., finance, own, permit, design, build, operate) of a landfill gas (LFG) energy project** for the Lee's Summit Resource Recovery Park. The City is seeking proposals for the management of LFG in an environmentally responsible and safe manner that will provide consistent, long-term revenue streams to the City.

The Resource Recovery Park is a closed sanitary waste landfill that accepted waste from 1981 to 2019 and has a voluntary, active gas collection and control system. The average LFG flow rate to the flare in 2023 was approximately 398 standard cubic feet per minute at 50 percent methane. The RFP provides monthly LFG flow rates for 2023–2024 and estimated future LFG recovery potential.
