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The Department has received a Part 70 Operating Permit Renewal Application for this facility and has drafted an operating permit that will allow the facility to continue to operate as a major source under the requirements of SC Regulation 61-62.70 - Title V Operating Permit Program. This permit will enable the facility to operate in compliance with state and federal air quality regulations. The draft/proposed permit has not yet been approved and is open to comment from the public, affected states, and the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). If approved, this draft/proposed permit will supersede the existing Title V Operating Permit issued to this facility on August 28, 2019.

The draft/proposed permit includes the following changes:

- The facility corrected the maximum throughput from 2 cars per day to 6 cars per day which led to an increase in VOCs, particulate matter, and HAP emissions. No other emission changes resulted from this change and no additional equipment was added or physical change made.
- Particulate Matter (PM) Increase of 4.94 tons per year,
- Particulate Matter less than 10 micrometers in diameter (PM₁₀) Increase of 4.94 tons per year,
- Particulate Matter less than 2.5 micrometers in diameter (PM_{2.5}) Increase of 4.94 tons per year,
- Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) Increase of 7.31 tons per year,
- Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) Increase of 5.71 tons per year

The draft/proposed permit is also undergoing a parallel permit review by the EPA. Should the Department receive significant comments on the draft/proposed permit and/or make substantive changes, EPA may exercise its rights for an additional 45-day review. However, if no significant comments are received, and no substantive changes have been made, the permit may be issued following the parallel review period.

Comments should specify, in as much detail as possible, the air quality related issues and identify the portion(s) of the state and/or federal air quality regulations that are of concern and have not been adequately addressed in the draft/proposed permit. All comments received by the end of the notice period (Should the comment period end on a weekend or state holiday, comments will be accepted up until close of business the next working day), will be considered when making a decision to approve, disapprove, or modify the draft/proposed permit. Please bring this notice to the attention of persons you know will be interested in this matter.

Where there is a significant amount of public interest, the Department may hold a public hearing and/or meeting to receive additional comments. Public hearing and/or meeting requests should be made to the Director of Air Permitting Division at 2600 Bull Street, Columbia, SC 29201 or through the Department's website (<u>https://epermweb.dhec.sc.gov/ncore/external/publicnotice/info/-1111021635703561206/comments</u>). Any requests for a public hearing and/or meeting must be made within the 30-day public comment period. If a public hearing is requested and scheduled, notice of said public hearing will be given thirty (30) days in advance.
