## **Stationary Combustion Turbines – New Source Performance Standards Notice of Proposed Rulemaking Virtual Public Hearing: Frequently Asked Questions**

### **How can I register to speak at the hearing?**

### **I don't want to speak at the hearing, but I'd like to watch it. Do I need to register?**

### **What platform will EPA use to conduct the hearing on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2025?**

EPA will conduct the hearing remotely using Zoom video conferencing service. Registrants will receive a Zoom link prior to the hearing.

### **I haven't used Zoom before. How do I testify during the hearing?**

If you plan to testify using your computer or smartphone, you can download the Zoom software by going to the [Zoom download page](#) or the Apple or Android App Store (for smartphones). Note that if you are participating in the hearing by video, your computer must have operating camera, microphone, and audio functions.

If you do not have access to a computer with operating camera, microphone, and audio functions, you may testify by phone by dialing the Zoom-generated phone numbers you received in your registration confirmation email.

### **How can I comment on the proposal?**

There are two ways to comment on EPA's proposed rule:

1. Comment at the public hearing: You must register to provide testimony.
2. Comment in writing: Comments must be received to the regulatory docket on or before March 13, 2025.

#### **How can I submit comments in writing?**

There are multiple ways to submit comments on EPA's proposed rule in writing. As a reminder, verbal and written comments are weighed equally. You may send comments, identified by Docket ID No. EPA-HQ-OAR-2024-0419, by any of the following methods:
