Re: Referral of Civil Rights Complaint

Dear Mr. Rodriguez:

On March 12, 2013, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Office of Civil Rights (OCR), received a letter in regard to the rejection of Title VI complaint (No. 08R-11-R4). The complaint stated that the City of Brooksville, Hernando County, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP), and the Florida Department of Health (DOH) ("entities") intentionally discriminated against (b)(6) Privacy, (b)(7)(C) Ent. Priv. by denying the citizens of South Brooksville a safe and healthy community.¹ Specifically, (b)(6) Privacy, (b)(7)(C) Ent. Priv. stated that they have allowed ten (10) contaminated sites in the City of Brooksville, a residential community, to spew chemicals from 1948 until October 12, 2011.²

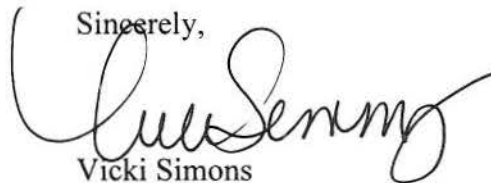
Specifically, (b)(6) Privacy, (b)(7)(C) Ent. Priv. alleged that African Americans did not have the opportunity to provide input in the 2012 Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) Health Needs Assessment. Due to the nature of the allegation, OCR has determined that it would be more appropriate for the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to investigate this matter. OCR, therefore, is referring the July 21, 2011, and March 12, 2013, allegations to HHS for review and action. A copy of the complaint letter is enclosed with this correspondence. We have also copied the complainant on this letter to acknowledge that we have forwarded this complaint to you. EPA is enclosing the complainant's supplemental clarifying information and original complaint for your reference.
