

DEMAND LETTER

To Whom It May Concern:

We had several meetings with various representatives from the police department and North End committee – that is full of family members and we would like to address our concerns of the poor police assistance and abuse in North Palm Springs. It has come to our attention that more and more residents are having more problems with the Palm Springs police department in simple communication. This is widespread in youth as well as adults. We feel that this is a conflict of interest of them trying to represent us as a whole community. Tuesday the 10th of March at our community faculty we had a meeting with various representatives of one of your police officers – bi(6) Privacy, (b)(7)(c) Enf. Privacy. He stated he came on his own because of concerns he had for our community. We feel that the meeting was under minded and sidetracked from concerns we brought up to Chamber of Commerce on February 27th 2009. We need higher representative from the Chief of Police Dominguez with our concerns regarding police actions and abuse and their bylaws of getting involved in civil matters with various family members.

Now here are our demands:

- We demand that the proper authorities of the health inspector of the city of Palm Springs
 come out and test our gym along with our own people at the Jessie O James Community
 Park Center for unhealthy environmental issues such as asbestos, mold, other toxins, etc.
- 2. We demand the gym to be closed down and further inspection to be taken to let us know that it is safe to reopen. Also our lawyer have access to test the gym as well.
- This is a demand through City planning and permits department regarding Berkley environmental trucks and people in hazmat uniforms right inside our community residence of North Palm Springs and Mountain Gate Community back in April 2008. Why were we not properly informed and not let known what was going on in a residential area. It was scary to the community and alarming because of all the different elements of sickness people in the community are contracting.
- 4. Why were property owners before purchasing told that it was a military site from back in the 1940's? We did our research and found regarding this information. We have all our proof in documents in place. We would like to sit down with your officials starting with the mayor and police chief as well as the City planning and permits department.

We now realize the whole community has been stereotyped and played against each other when called for assistance. This is unacceptable and has to stop immediately. We are asking for your cooperation with us. CRISIS CRY FOR HELP AND IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE FOR CIVIL RIGHTS AND JUSTICE ACCORDING TO WRITTEN LAWS. INVESTIGATION AND PROTECTION FROM FBI AND WASHINGTON TO RESOLVE AND CORRECT INJUSTICE.

- 1. Old Black Lady Murdered at the hands of her great-great-grand-daughter.
- 2. Palm Springs Police Department dishonored five restraining orders that had they been honored, would have prevented the historical gross elder abuse, murder and death of O(0) Private, (0)(7)(C) Ent. Private,
- 3. Formal complaints and official reports made to the Palm Springs and Palm Desert Police Departments by Native Americans, Latino and Black Americans are disregarded by way of disposing of the hardcopy complaints in the trash. All complaints are mishandled, delayed by verbal commitment of future appointments (never granted) and or handed from hand to hand with no real action. Court ordered rights are completely disregarded by the Palm Springs Police Department. Incident reports including 911 calls, restraining orders, and investigations are tainted by fraud, police misconduct, business community conspiracy and citizen conspiracy by police officers including the levels of sergeant and lieutenant. Sergeants and Lieutenants are investigators of complaints filed against them
- Gross violation of civil rights against minorities has resulted in the deaths of more than 50 men, women and children.
- 5. A study completed on 300 Larson Justice Center cases (White, Black, Hispanic), ALL containing the same identical charge revealed Whites walked with small fines and no jail time, Hispanics received more fines and jail time than did whites and Blacks received the highest and unprecedented jail times, fines and longest probations. The final conclusion of the report stated it was clear the injustice against blacks violated any degree of civil rights and more.
- 6. Law enforcement officers who are discharged, terminated, and/or have poor performance, charged with harassment, etc. are sent to the Coachella Valley and work in high ranking law enforcement positions and continue to practice racial, sexual, and gender discrimination. The most recent incident resulted in a pregnant Black American lady being hit and dragged to death (killing nine month fetus too) by a drunken (far above the legal alcohol limit) wife of a District Attorney Investigator. The investigator tampered with evidence, directed and arranged the bail, teiling bondsman what to do and say. The specific judge was chosen because he was soon to retire and would have no harm come to him. An in chamber deal was made to only give the

criminal murderer one charge of manslaughter. Sentencing was dodged by asking for time to receive cosmetic surgery, the only jail time is current house arrest under the guise of mental problems. All the assets of the criminal couple have been disposed of.

All evidence, DVD'S, photographs, taped conversations, eye witnesses, and police reports are in order and available for interview.
