Re: Rejection and Referral of Administrative Complaint

Dear Warden Valenzuela:

This letter is in regards to the complaint received by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Office of Civil Rights (OCR), on September 19, 2012. The complaint alleged that the California Men's Colony State Prison administration is "acting with deliberate indifference by purposefully and intentionally exposing prisoners to asbestos in their cells."¹ Because OCR has responsibility for processing complaints alleging a violation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (Title VI), 42 U.S.C. §§ 2000d *et seq.*, and EPA's nondiscrimination regulations found at 40 C.F.R. Part 7, we have assumed for purposes of processing the complaint that this is why the complaint was filed with this office.

Pursuant to EPA's nondiscrimination regulations, OCR conducts a preliminary review of discrimination complaints to determine acceptance, rejection, or referral. 40 C.F.R. § 7.120(d)(1). To be accepted for investigation, a complaint must meet the jurisdictional requirements described in EPA's Part 7 regulations. First, it must be in writing. Second, it must describe an alleged discriminatory act that, if true, would violate EPA's nondiscrimination regulations (*i.e.*, an alleged discriminatory act based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability). Third, it must be filed within 180 days of the alleged discriminatory act. Finally, the complaint must be filed against an applicant for, or recipient of, EPA assistance that allegedly committed the discriminatory act. (A copy of EPA's nondiscrimination regulations is enclosed for your convenience.)

After careful review, OCR is rejecting the complaint for investigation because it does not meet the jurisdictional requirements described in EPA's nondiscrimination regulations. One of OCR's jurisdictional requirements to be able to conduct an investigation is that the complaint must be filed against a recipient of EPA financial

assistance. The California Men's Colony State Prison is not a recipient of EPA financial assistance. Additionally, allegations must describe an alleged discriminatory act that, if true, may violate EPA's nondiscrimination regulations. The complaint does not allege claims on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. Therefore, the complaint is not within EPA OCR jurisdiction to investigate, and OCR must reject the complaint for investigation.

However, because the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) may have subject matter expertise over the allegations in this complaint and the California Men's Colony State Prison may be a recipient of DOJ, the EPA is referring this complaint to DOJ for review and investigation as they deem appropriate.
