RE: The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region 6 Extension of Current Approval of Clean Harbors, LLC for Commercial Storage and Disposal by High Temperature Incineration of Liquid and Solid Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs) at the Deer Park Facility Located in La Porte, Texas; EPA ID No. TXD055141378

Dear Ms. Kelley:

The EPA is currently reviewing your renewal application and supplemental information for the PCB authorization submitted through October 2, 2024, for compliance with the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), 40 CFR 761.65 and 40 CFR 761.70. We are also reviewing your information in conjunction with the EPA's October 2019 guidance "Guidance for Applicants Requesting to Treat/Dispose of PCBs using Incineration or an Alternative Method." In addition, the EPA is fulfilling its obligations under the Endangered Species Act and the National Historic Preservation Act.

As discussed on February 21, 2025, and confirmed in your response on February 27, 2025, we agree with May 13, 2026, as the date for the new PCB Trial Burn, and look forward to receiving your submittal of the PCB trial burn plan by May 31, 2025. In order to allow for full consideration and review of your submitted information and any subsequent public participation, the EPA is extending your current approval pursuant to regulations promulgated under section 6(e) of the TSCA and codified in 40 CFR Part 761. The EPA finds that extending your current approval for the commercial storage and high temperature incineration of liquid and solid PCBs until October 6, 2025, does not present an unreasonable risk of injury to health or the environment.
