	• Significant improvements in visibility have occurred over the past 20 years as a result of Clean Air Act and state actions.
	The federal program must evolve to allow for demonstrated improvements that avoid unnecessary burdens for states and industry.
Important facts on regulation/program	The Clean Air Act established a national goal of eliminating manmade visibility impairment at national parks and wilderness areas. Currently, this program covers 156 identified Class I areas. EPA rules issued pursuant to the CAA implement this program.
