

<b>Power Plant Carbon Dioxide Rule</b> Powering the Great American Comeback Fact Sheet	
<b>Action</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Reconsideration of “New Source Performance Standards for Greenhouse Gas Emissions from New, Modified, and Reconstructed Fossil Fuel-Fired Electric Generating Units; Emission Guidelines for Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Existing Fossil Fuel-Fired Electric Generating Units; and Repeal of the Affordable Clean Energy Rule” (89 FR 39798; May 9, 2024).</li> </ul>
<b>Reasons for Action</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Concerns that the regulation may not be squarely grounded in statutory authority.</li> <li>Concerns have been raised that the standards of performance are based on control technologies that are not adequately demonstrated or are too costly.</li> <li>Unleashes homegrown energy—when coal plants are open, viable and thriving, we won’t have to rely on energy sources from adversaries.</li> <li>Concerns raised the regulation would create an undue burden on certain new natural gas-fired combustion turbines and certain coal-fired power plants.</li> <li>Concerns that EPA underestimated the compliance costs, and that the regulation endangers the ability for utilities and other power providers to reliably supply electricity to their customers</li> </ul>
<b>Important facts on regulation/program</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Costs \$15 billion over the next 20 years (close to \$1 billion per year)</li> <li>This rule would drive household electric bills up by 1.4 percent in 2035.</li> <li>The rule would reduce generation from coal-fired power plants by up to 42 percent.</li> <li>From the moment the rule was proposed, it became much harder to raise capital for new natural gas power plants.</li> </ul>
