Thank you for your strong leadership in your first few weeks as Administrator. As Governor of South Dakota, I look forward to working with you on commonsense policies that protect our citizens' health and environment while still ensuring their freedom.


With agriculture being South Dakota's number one industry, I am an advocate for our farmers and am eager to see a nationwide solution to E15 gasoline. In 2022, South Dakota, along with 7 other midwestern states, requested removal of the one-pound Reid Vapor Pressure waiver through the Clean Air Act.

There was hope a federal solution would come to fruition, eliminating the impending state-by-state approach. With the final rule implementation nearing, I have heard concerns from South Dakota's petroleum industry, specifically in the westernmost part of the state. Potential supply chain disruptions in this region have been exacerbated from a recent incident at a refinery which supplies much of western South Dakota.

With that, I am requesting delayed implementation no earlier than the spring of 2026 in the following counties: Butte, Custer, Fall River, Harding, Lawrence, Meade, Oglala Lakota, Pennington, and Perkins.

As we continue to seek a permanent national solution, we also urge the issuance of emergency fuel waivers to allow for the year-round sale of E15 gasoline due to supply chain concerns.
