Presented below are water quality standards that are in effect for Clean Water Act purposes.

EPA is posting these standards as a convenience to users and has made a reasonable effort to assure their accuracy. Additionally, EPA has made a reasonable effort to identify parts of the standards that are not approved, disapproved, or are otherwise not in effect for Clean Water Act purposes.

Title 6 New York Codes, Rules and Regulations (NYCRR) Express Terms for Sections 701.26, 701.27, and 703.4

Effective December 20, 2024

The attached provisions are included as a supplement to the New York Water Quality Regulations posted on EPA's repository page because they have not yet been incorporated in the regulations. The attached express terms are in effect for Clean Water Act (CWA) purposes with the following exceptions:

• The EPA took **no action** on the MS4 language at Section 701.26(a) because the state intends to remove this language in the spring of 2025.

6 NYCRR §§ 703.4

- The EPA **disapproved** revised coliform water quality criteria for Class I and Class SD surface waters because they are not scientifically defensible and not protective of the primary contact recreation designated use of Class I and Class SD saline surface waters.

 - <u>EPA disapproved the following:</u> "The monthly median value and more than 20 percent of the samples, from a minimum of five examinations, shall not exceed 2,400 and 5,000, respectively."

 - Class I water fecal coliform:

 - Class SD waters total coliform:
 - <u>EPA disapproved the following:</u> "The monthly median value and more than 20 percent of the samples, from a minimum of five examinations, shall not exceed 2,400 and 5,000, respectively."
 - <u>The criteria that remain in effect for CWA purposes:</u> No applicable total coliform criterion
 - Class SD water fecal coliform:
 - <u>EPA disapproved the following:</u> "The monthly geometric mean, from a minimum of five examinations, shall not exceed 200."
 - <u>The criteria that remain in effect for CWA purposes:</u> No applicable fecal coliform criterion
- The EPA took **no action** on the addition of Class I enterococci criteria at Section 703.4(d). These criteria are not currently in effect for CWA purposes. Please refer to EPA's December 2024 Action Letter posted on EPA's repository for approved enterococci criteria.

(a) The *symbol (WW)*, appearing in an entry in the "standards" column in the classification tables of Parts 800 through 941 of this Title, means that the classified waters in that specific item are influenced by wet weather discharges from combined sewer overflows (CSO) and/or municipal separate stormwater sewer systems (MS4) effluents. Any water quality standard, guidance value, or thermal criterion that specifies a (WW) exception would apply to waters where the (WW) symbol is listed in the standard column, otherwise the base water quality standard, guidance value, or thermal criterion assigned to the Class are applicable.
