# Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe

- Reservation established in 1935 by an Act of Congress
- 1,595 acres of land
- ~180 Tribal members with 70 residential homes on the Reservation
- 2 casinos, commercial and light industrial development




Figure 2: General Location

# Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe

- Landscape ranges from rolling hills to valleys
- Vegetation varies from riparian to Ponderosa Pine
- Granite Creek (1.7 miles)
- 4 ephemeral tributaries:
  - Slaughterhouse Gulch
  - Government Canyon Wash
  - Goat Spring Wash
  - Unnamed Wash




Figure 6: Surface Water Sampling Sites
