

Background

- Paiute families occupied land in northwest Nevada surrounding Summit Lake since time immemorial, including the *Agai Panina Ticutta*, or the "Lake Trout Eaters"
- 1913, Summit Lake Indian Reservation was established and included 5,000 acres of land.
- 1965, the Tribe was federally recognized.
- Modern reservation is roughly 14,000 acres, encompassing Summit Lake.
- There are no full-time residents living on the reservation







Background

- Paiute families relied on the fisheries, aquatic resources, and vegetation for their way of life.
- Summit Lake is 1 of 2 lakes with a self-sustaining population of Lahontan cutthroat trout (LCT), which remain culturally important to the Tribe, and a focus of our conservation efforts.





The mission of the Natural Resources Department is to promote conservation, protection, and enhancement of Tribal natural resources. The Department manages a wide array of programs and projects funded through various federal agencies. Through these programs and projects, Natural Resources staff work to assert the Tribe's sovereignty in protecting the environment and natural resources of the Summit Lake Indian Reservation and the Tribe's traditional territory

Outreach Significance

- Tribal youth constitute a large portion of the Membership, and outreach can be especially impactful for them.
- Great way for our department to share our work with the Council and Tribe in a meaningful way.
- Impactful way for our department to learn from the Tribe and to connect with them.
- The outreach Event is especially important; some Members have never been to the reservation before, or this is one of the few events they can travel to the reservation for.
- Allows Staff and Tribal Members to connect with other agencies: EPA, BIA, USFWS, UNR, and BLM.




