Environmental Protection Agency, Region III, plans to reissue a final underground injection control (UIC) permit, PAS2R904BVEN, under the authority of the Federal UIC regulations at 40 CFR Part 144, Section 144.37, "Continuation of Expiring Permits," to Lesher Oil Company, Pleasantville, Pennsylvania.

On June 22, 1989, the above referenced permit was issued then to the Pennsylvania General Energy Corporation, Warren, Pennsylvania for up to five Class IIR enhanced recovery injection wells used for the enhanced recovery of oil from a facility known as the Reno Property, located on Shafer Run Road, Sugar Creek Borough, Venango County, Pennsylvania. Ownership of this facility has since been transferred to Lesher Oil Company. On June 22, 1999 this permit will expire. Lesher Oil Company has requested that EPA renew this permit. The company has been permitted to continue operating under the conditions of the expired permit while EPA takes appropriate steps to reissue this permit.

The Administrative Record for this permit action remains available for public inspection during normal business hours at the office of the Safe Drinking Water Act Branch in the Office of Compliance and Enforcement of EPA Region III, 1650 Arch Street Building in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. OIL CITY LIBRARY MEETING ROOM

The public Meeting Room of the Oil City Library is available on equal terms to all non-profit groups and individuals in the library's service area, regardless of the beliefs and affiliations of the individual or of the group members. Granting permission to use the Library facility does not constitute endorsement by the Library Commission or the staff of the user or of his beliefs.

Use of the room is in accordance with the Library Bill of Rights which states in Article 6, "As an institution of education for democratic living, the library should welcome the use of its meeting rooms for socially useful and cultural activities and discussion of current public questions. Such meeting places should be available on equal terms to all groups in the community regardless of the beliefs and affiliations of their members, provided that the meetings be open to the public."

The Meeting Room will be available for public use only during the hours the library is open.

The Meeting Room is for meetings and programs of an educational, informational, cultural, or civic nature to enhance the library's role as an institution which connects people with information. The Room may also be used by for-profit organizations or for social functions for a fee.

Users shall pay the cost of repair for any damage to the facilities.





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

After that hearing last July, a court order was issued requiring him to pay current and overdue support.

Neal has appealed that order to state Superior Court. With no payment made, a contempt hearing was held Friday.

After the hearing, Neal was ordered to pay \$100 a month toward the arrearage and a

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minimum of \$250 must be turned over to DRO by Monday or he will be jailed until payment is made, said an order handed down yesterday.

To accommodate Neal's position on his money going to the household of his ex-wife who no longer has custody of the girl — the judge and the exwife agreed the money could be deposited by DRO in a trust accessible only to the daughter.


