

- 3. Register or ensure active status in Grants.gov
- 4. Designate an Authorized Organization Representative (AOR) in Grants.gov



### Lowe's Foundation History

- Founded in 1957 as the Lowe's Charitable & Educational Foundation
- 501(c)3 organization with an independent board of directors
- In 2019, changed its name to the Lowe's Foundation
- As a public charity, hosts annual Building Futures fundraiser events with key vendor partners
- In 2023, the Foundation expanded its national commitment to skilled trades training through Gable Grants
- Since 2023, The Lowe's Foundation has invested \$34M in support of 53 partners

## \$50M commitment over 5 years to prepare 50,000 individuals for skilled trades careers

### Why Wraparound Services Matter

- Wraparound services are <u>not an</u>
   eligible use of BFJT grant funds, but
   they are mission-critical.
  - Retention: Supportive services help trainees stay the course.
  - Graduation: Address barriers to learning and attendance.
  - Employment: Enable graduates to succeed and remain in the workforce.




## What Are Wraparound Services?

#### Common Wraparound Services:


- Case management & mentoring
- Mental health & substance use counseling
- Housing assistance
- Digital literacy & life skills training
- Legal aid (e.g., record expungement)
- Language access & cultural navigation

\*\*Not funded by EPA BFJT grants, but often supported by partners!



### Strategies for Wraparound Services

- Leverage partners for in-kind services (e.g., local housing orgs)
- Co-locate services with workforce centers or community colleges
- Apply for co-funding (e.g., HUD, DOL, state/local workforce grants)
- Establish MOUs with social service providers
- Empower graduates as peer mentors and case managers



## Potential Support Partners

- Local banks (financial literacy training)
- Health and human services
- Correctional and reentry services
- Reduced or free transportation passes from local departments of transportation
- Legal aid and re-entry nonprofits
- Faith based support services
- Local community development corporations
- Nonprofits, community centers, and foundations
- Community colleges
