SUBJECT: Reallotment of Fiscal Year 2021 Base, 2022 BIL, and 2023 BIL Drinking Water State

Revolving Funds

This memorandum announces the availability of reallotted federal fiscal year 2021 base Drinking Water State Revolving Fund dollars. These funds originated from the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (P.L. 116-260). This memo also announces the availability of reallotted FY 2022 and FY 2023 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law DWSRF dollars. These funds originated from the BIL (P.L. 117-58), also known as the "Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021." This action makes critical additional drinking water infrastructure funds, including those for lead service line replacement and emerging contaminants, available to states across the nation. The EPA will announce the availability of reallotted FY 2023 BIL DWSRF Lead Service Line Replacement dollars in the coming months.

Below is a description of the funds that states declined and the amounts that remain unobligated:

- In 2022, the state of Wyoming declined its entire FY 2021 base capitalization grant totaling \$11,001,000. These funds have already gone through a first round of reallotment. See *Reallotment of FY 2021 DWSRF Funds*, January 2023.
 - The remaining \$777,000 of FY 2021 base funds are now available to 25 states, Washington, D.C., and the Tribes.
- In 2023, the states of Alaska, Hawaii, Maine, Nevada, Oregon, South Dakota, and Washington declined a total of \$219,469,603 of their FY 2022 BIL LSLR allotments. These funds have already gone through a first round of reallotment. See <u>Reallotment of Fiscal Year 2022 Drinking Water</u>

 State Revolving Fund Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Funds, November 2023.
 - The remaining \$72,289,000 of FY 2022 BIL LSLR funds are now available to 31 states and Washington, D.C.
- In 2023, the state of Oklahoma declined \$4,977,376 of its FY 2022 BIL Emerging Contaminant allotment. These funds have already gone through a first round of reallotment. See November 2023 memo linked directly above.

- The remaining \$1,190,000 of FY 2022 BIL EC funds are now available to 37 states and Washington, D.C.
- In 2024, the states of Tennessee and Wyoming declined a total of \$20,501,000 of their FY 2023 BIL EC allotments.
 - The \$20,501,000 of FY 2023 EC funds are now available to the 48 other states, Puerto Rico, and Washington, D.C.

By law, the EPA must reallot unobligated funds after the second fiscal year of availability. All DWSRF programs (the 50 states and Puerto Rico) that received their full DWSRF allotment within the two years of availability are eligible for reallotted funds, as well as Washington, D.C. The process is explained in the September 11, 2020, memorandum, "State Revolving Fund Capitalization Grant Reallotment Procedure." If funds remain unobligated after a year of reallotment, a sequential reallotment round occurs involving the entities that applied for and received their reallotment within one fiscal year. The states that declined original funding or reallotted funding are ineligible for sequential reallotted funds.

Attachments A, E, F, and H list the state-by-state FY 2021 base, FY 2022 BIL LSLR, FY 2022 BIL EC, and FY 2023 BIL EC reallotment amounts, respectively. By statute, the EPA uses the same reallotment formula as was originally used to allot the funds, removing ineligible states.

Eligible states, Puerto Rico, and Washington, D.C. have until September 30, 2025, to apply for and receive their portion(s) of the reallotted funds. Any available funds remaining unawarded after that date will be available for reallotment.

These reallotted funds carry all program requirements and authorities associated with the respective FY 2021 base appropriation, FY 2022 BIL LSLR or EC appropriation, and FY 2023 BIL EC appropriation, and all current statutory requirements. For the BIL funds, regions and states should review the March 2022, memorandum *Implementation of the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Provisions of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law*, as well as each year's allotment announcement memo. Note that per the December 2024 *Rescission of PN-2023-G01-R1: Investing in America Signage Term and Condition* memorandum, BIL signage is no longer required for assistance agreements signed on or after December 5, 2024. Attachments C, D, G, and I show the state-by-state mandatory additional subsidy amounts for the corresponding appropriations.

Please see the above mentioned September 2020 reallotment memorandum for details about mechanisms regions may use to award the funds and expectations for commitments and disbursements.
