



Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF)

DWSRF programs are federal-state partnerships in all 50 states and Puerto Rico that provide low-cost financing for water infrastructure projects to ensure safe drinking water for communities across the U.S.

WHAT CAN WATER SYSTEMS DO WITH THESE FUNDS?

- Build or upgrade drinking water treatment facilities
- Install, replace, or rehabilitate transmission and distribution mains
- Replace service lines, including lead service lines, on public or private property
- Address emerging contaminants, such as PFAS
- Construct or rehabilitate surface water intake structures and raw water transmission mains, and drill new wells
- Build or rehabilitate water storage tanks
- Create a new water system
- Consolidate water systems
- Increase resilience and emergency preparedness of water systems
- Enhance physical and cyber security measures

WHO CAN GET FUNDING?

- Community water systems (publicly or privately owned)
- Non-profit non-community water systems



PROGRAM FEATURES

- Below-market interest rates, with some interest-free options
- Repayment deferral up to 18 months from project completion
- Loan terms of up to 30 years, or up to 40 years for state-defined disadvantaged communities
- Potential loan forgiveness or grants available for projects such as those addressing emerging contaminants, lead service lines, or state-defined disadvantaged communities
- Ability to finance 100% of eligible project costs
- Debt refinancing
- Typically no minimum or maximum project size
