ORDER ON ELECTRONIC SERVICE OF DOCUMENTS¹

Before the Environmental Appeals Board.

Per Curiam:

By this order, the Environmental Appeals Board (“EAB”) replaces its September 21, 2020 order entitled *Revised Order Authorizing Electronic Service of Documents in Permit and Enforcement Appeals* and clarifies that parties may utilize email to fulfill their service requirements *in all matters* that can be filed with the EAB.² Pursuant to this order, obtaining prior consent is not required to serve another party by email. Parties must promptly file notices informing the EAB and the other parties of any changes in their email addresses.

The EAB in its discretion may modify these requirements as appropriate on a case-by-case basis and may revoke or amend this order at any time. This order creates no vested rights in any party.

This order extends the use of service by email to all other matters, as indicated in the text above.
