- Other specified program reports.

share permit, compliance monitoring (e.g., inspection), violation determination, and enforcement action time as needed (up to but not extending past December 21, 2028). program reports. The NPDES eRule also provides states with additional flexibility to request additional and enforcement action data. Phase 2 ends December 21, 2025 and includes general permit forms and two phases. Phase 1 ended December 21, 2016, and included DMRs, and state compliance monitoring data with U.S. EPA.
