EPA NOTICE OF VIOLATION SCAM

In this phishing scam, a fraudster sends a falsified EPA Notice of Violation letter to a target business and requests that the business respond by phone or email.

The U.S. EPA Office of Inspector General is issuing a fraud alert to highlight this increasingly common scam.
