Project Description

The Jet Utilities Authority (JUA) struggled to maintain compliance with the Lead and Copper Rule since 2009. However, with the help of multiple financing opportunities, including an \$862,000 DWSRF loan with \$250,000 in principal forgiveness, the system was able to return to compliance and provide safe, reliable drinking water to the 200 people in this disadvantaged community. With their funding, the JUA constructed a new chemical feed building, a 50,000-gallon elevated storage tank and rehabilitated an existing storage tank.

The corrosion control introduced in this project addresses the lead and copper concerns and ensures improved water quality for the residents of Jet. This project was kept affordable for those in the community by combining both federal and state funding sources. **The Jet Utilities Authority used a DWSRF loan totaling \$862,000 with \$250,000 principal forgiveness and an \$89,000 grant through the Rural Energy for America Program from the Oklahoma Water Resources Board.**
