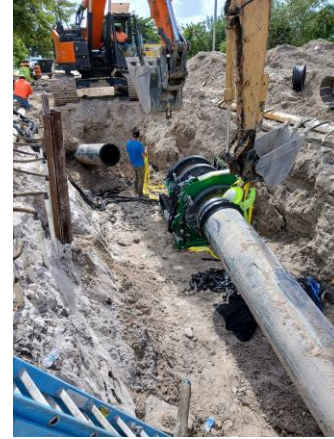

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Water, Wastewater, & Stormwater Integrated Master Plan Project will allow the City of Wilton Manors to implement essential upgrades to its water, wastewater, and stormwater infrastructure. Key components of the project include the replacement of aging water mains, rehabilitation and replacement of wastewater lift stations and force mains, and improvements to stormwater drainage systems. These enhancements will reduce the risk of pipeline failures, minimize water loss, and improve system reliability, particularly during emergencies such as storm events. In addition, the city will address compliance with a 2021 consent order issued by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection aimed at protecting waterbodies by preventing wastewater overflows. Overall, the project will increase the city's water system capacity, reduce infiltration and leakage within its sewer and stormwater systems, and improve overall system efficiency.

PROJECT AND FINANCING BENEFITS

- Increases water system capacity while improving reliability.
- Improves sewer and stormwater system performance by reducing infiltration.
- Provides flexibility through customizable repayment schedules and draw features that allow the city to choose when to pay for project components, reducing upfront interest costs over the life of the loan.
