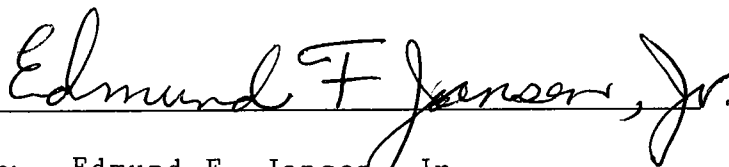

SUMMARY: MARCH 2007

During the past year Rollinsford established a Water Quality Committee that collected water samples for test on Fresh Creek and its tributaries in the Town of Rollinsford. The Planning Board proposed an increase in setbacks for wet land and water bodies from 25 feet to 50 feet, which was passed at the March 2007 Town Meeting. The Highway Department continued its program of catch basin cleaning and repaired road washouts that occurred during spring flood in the town. Construction of a parking deck at the Wentworth Douglass Hospital, just inside the town line incorporated the use of devices to catch any pollution runoff before it could enter adjacent wetlands. The need for more storm drains for existing homes with sump pumps built 60 years or more calls for funding sources.
