Re: Termination of Coverage under the General Air Quality Permit for New or Modified Minor Source Stone Quarrying, Crushing, and Screening Facilities in Indian Country for the San Juan Lateral Water Treatment Plant Rock Crusher (Source ID #112)

Dear Brandon Baldwin,

On May 21, 2025, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 9 (EPA) approved a Request for Coverage under the General Air Quality Permit for New or Modified Minor Source Stone Quarrying, Crushing, and Screening Facilities in Indian Country (SQCS General Permit) for the San Juan Lateral Water Treatment Plant Rock Crusher ("Source"), Source ID #112, pursuant to the provisions of Clean Air Act sections 110(a) and 301(d) and the EPA's Federal Indian Country Minor New Source Review (NSR) Program at Code of Federal Regulations title 40, sections 49.151-161 (Tribal Minor NSR Program).

On December 8, 2025, the U.S. EPA received your notification that Source operations had completed on October 30, 2025, and that the Source was removed from the location on November 3, 2025. As such, the EPA is terminating the Source's coverage under the SQCS General Permit as of the signature date of this letter.

Any future project at the Source may trigger federal tribal permitting requirements.

If in the future any new emissions units are installed at the Source location, or if operations are planned to resume, you may need to submit a permit application or new request for coverage under the Tribal Minor NSR Program.
