### **MEMORANDUM**

**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Year 2026 Allotments for the State Revolving Fund Provisions of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and Base Program Funding

**TO:** Water Division Directors, Regions I-X

This memorandum provides final allotment tables for the fiscal year 2026 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act State Revolving Fund General Supplemental and Emerging Contaminants capitalization grants, as well as Base program funds appropriated under the Commerce, Justice, Science; Energy and Water Development; and Interior and Environment Appropriations Act, 2026 (P.L. 119-74) (hereinafter the 2026 Appropriations Act) for the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF and DWSRF) Programs.<sup>1</sup> Terms and conditions will be available to regions on the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency SRF SharePoint site.

This memorandum does not include allotment tables for the FY 2026 IJJA Lead Service Line Replacement capitalization grants. The EPA will announce those allotments when they are finalized.

#### **I. GENERAL UPDATES**

- Congress did not earmark Congressionally Directed Community Grants from the SRF funds in FY 2025 but did again in FY 2026. Therefore, the SRF funding available to states in FY 2026 decreased.
- The EPA encourages states to fund eligible projects that address the unique water quality issues in their state and advance priorities such as returning to and maintaining compliance, supporting water infrastructure needs within small and rural communities, and addressing challenges such as PFAS, lead, nitrate, and arsenic contamination in drinking water.
- The EPA's Regions should ensure the state SRF managers are aware that, per the IJJA statute, state match for the FY 2026 IJJA General Supplemental Capitalization Grants remains at 20 percent.

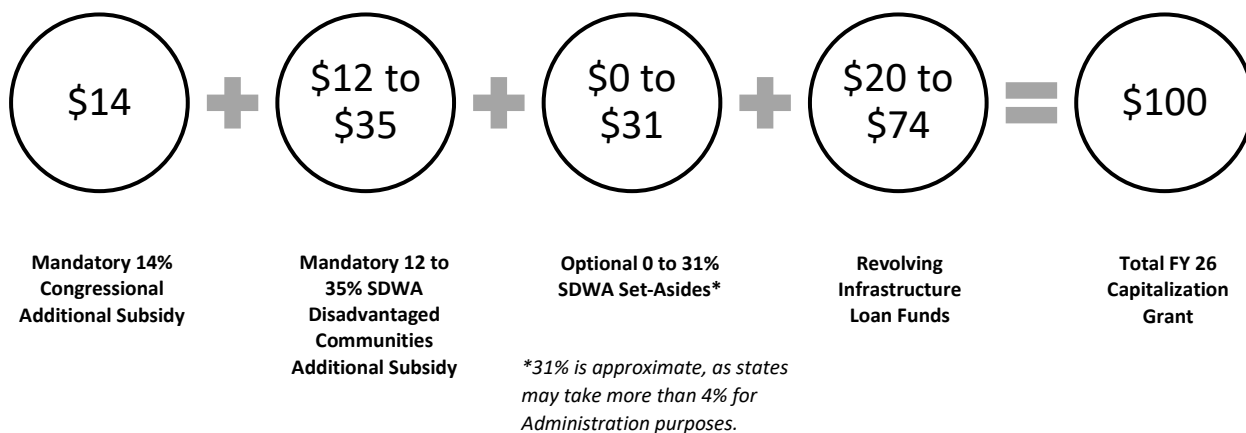
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<sup>1</sup> CWSRF funds are allotted based on percentages from Section 205(c)(3) of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1285(c)(3)). The percentages are adjusted to account for the Pacific Trust Territories being ineligible to receive CWSRF funds and American Samoa, Guam, Northern Marianas, and the Virgin Islands being funded through the 1.5 percent territories set-aside. DWSRF funds are allotted based on the most recent needs survey, with a minimum 1 percent allotment, as indicated in Section 1452(a)(1)(D) of the Safe Drinking Water Act (42 USC §300j-12).

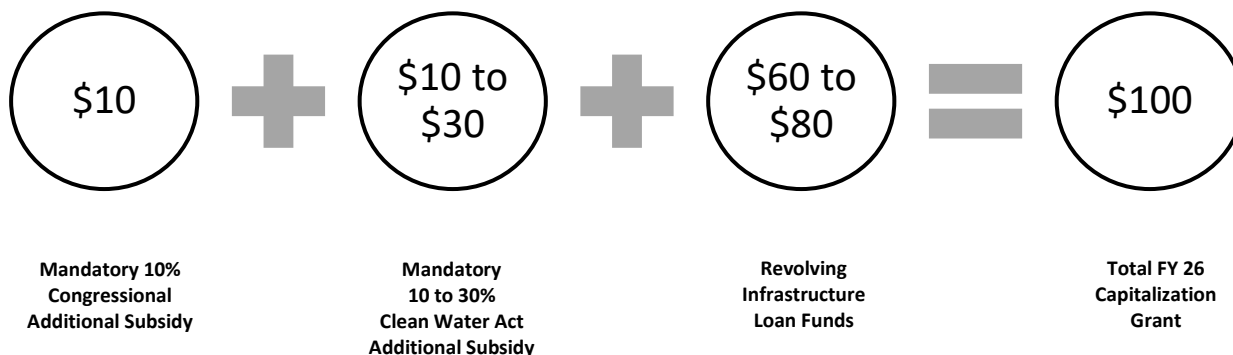
## II. ADDITIONAL SUBSIDY PROVISIONS

There are no changes in the additional subsidy authorities from FY 2025 to FY 2026. For the base program funding provided through the 2026 Appropriations Act, there are still two different additional subsidy authorities for each SRF. The diagrams below visually represent the mandatory additional subsidy authorities under the Base and IIJA General Supplemental capitalization grants. The IIJA Emerging Contaminant funding is 100 percent additional subsidy, so a diagram is not provided below. The DWSRF diagrams also include the optional set-aside funding amounts that states can take to administer a variety of state drinking water programs, as well as provide assistance to water systems. Funds provided as additional subsidy do not revolve and therefore states should be strategic in the amount of set-aside funding they take in conjunction with the additional subsidy.

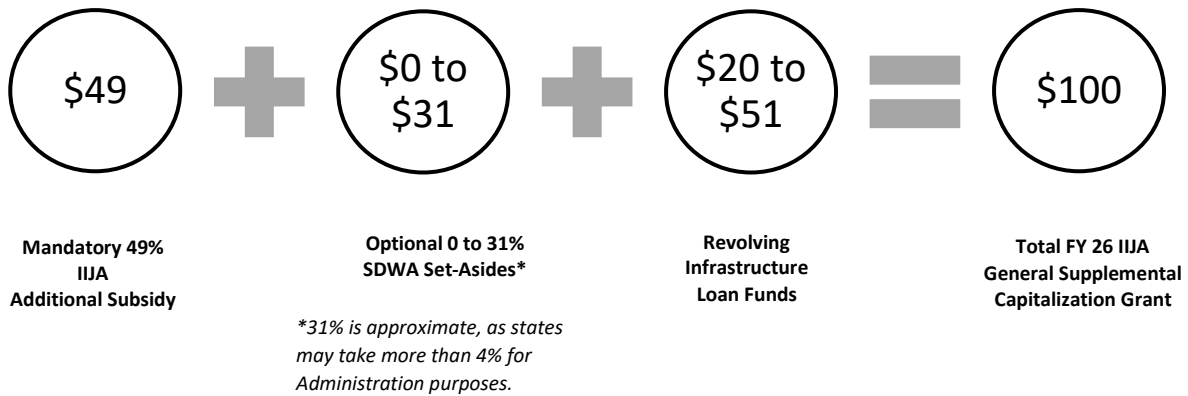
**Diagram 1: Example \$100 DWSRF FY 2026 Appropriations Act Capitalization Grant**



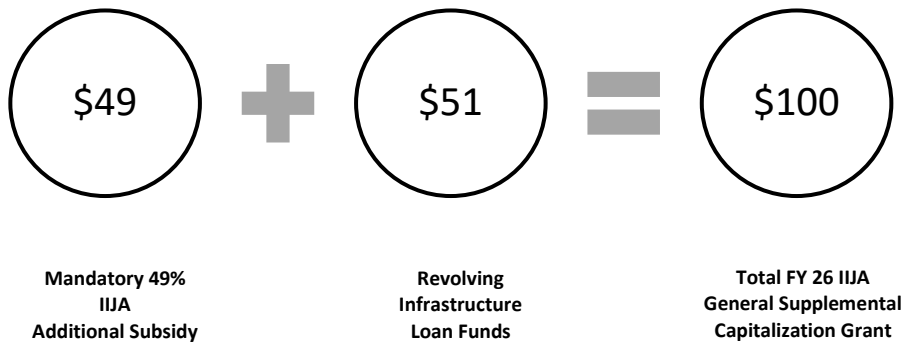
**Diagram 2: Example \$100 CWSRF FY 2026 Appropriations Act Capitalization Grant**
