### MEMORANDUM

**SUBJECT:** Reallotment of Fiscal Year 2022 IIJA Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act Lead Service Line Replacement Drinking Water State Revolving Funds

This memorandum announces the availability of reallotted FY 2022 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) (P.L. 117-58) Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Lead Service Line Replacement (LSLR) dollars. This action makes critical additional drinking water infrastructure funds for lead service line replacement available to states across the nation.

Below is a description of the funds available for reallotment:

- \$18,732,000 in FY 2022 IIJA LSLR funds are now available to 20 states and Washington, D.C. from declinations and deobligations.

By law, the EPA must reallot any unobligated funds after the second fiscal year of availability. All DWSRF programs (the 50 states and Puerto Rico) that received their full DWSRF allotment within the two years of availability are eligible for reallotted funds, as well as Washington, D.C. The process is explained in the September 11, 2020, memorandum, "[State Revolving Fund Capitalization Grant Reallotment Procedure.](#)"

In 2025, the EPA piloted a new process for reallotments. The EPA announced the amount of funds available for reallotment to eligible states and solicited interest. States that were not interested in the funds were removed from the reallotment formula. This new process will help ensure reallotted funds are directed more quickly to communities in need and will help reduce the administrative burden for both states and the EPA.

**Eligible states and Washington, D.C. have until September 30, 2026, to apply for and receive their portion(s) of the reallocated funds.** Any available funds remaining unawarded after that date will be available for reallocation.

Attachment A lists the state-by-state FY 2022 IIJA LSLR reallocation amounts. To arrive at these reallocation amounts the EPA removes ineligible states from the corresponding allotment formula. These reallocated funds carry all program requirements and authorities associated with the FY 2022 IIJA LSLR appropriation, and all current statutory requirements. Attachment B shows the state-by-state mandatory additional subsidy amounts for the appropriation.

Please see the abovementioned September 2020 reallocation memorandum for details about mechanisms regions may use to award the funds and expectations for commitments and disbursements.
