Dear Mr. Csonka:

The Director of the Land, Chemicals and Redevelopment Division of the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"), Region 2, has decided to issue a permit modification under the authority of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984 ("HSWA"), and EPA regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, to Ortho-Clinical Diagnostics, Inc. ("OCD") for its facility in Raritan, New Jersey. This Permit Modification includes supplements to Modules II (Facility Description), Module III (Corrective Action) of the facility's existing HSWA Permit which was originally issued in 1988. The Module II Supplement provides a more detailed and up-to-date description of the facility. The Module III Supplement: a) selects and requires implementation of a cleanup action at each of these four designated areas: (1) The TCE Plume; (2) SWMU 8; (3) SWMU 10; and (4) AOC 16; and b) selects "No Further Action" determinations for the following areas: SWMUs 1 to 7, SWMU 9, SWMU 11 to 13, AOCs 1 to 15, AOC 17 to 19, and ISRA-AOC 1 to 5. Effective January 1, 1998, the name of the Facility's operating entity was changed from ODSI to OCD with no change in ownership. Through a series of acquisitions, OCD became a wholly owned subsidiary of QuidelOrtho Corporation on May 27, 2022 following a business combination with Quidel Corporation. Among other requirements, the Permit Modification requires OCD to continue cleanup measures for hazardous waste remaining at the facility, and makes no further action determinations for some units or areas where no additional cleanup work will be required.

Enclosed are the Notice of Issuance and final HSWA Permit Modification, which includes EPA's Response to Comments giving EPA's responses to comments received during the public comment period held from September 5, 2025 through October 20, 2025.

Anyone wishing to appeal the Director's decision should refer to the procedures set forth in 40 C.F.R. § 124.19. That section states that within thirty (30) days after the date of the service of this Notice, any person who filed comments on the draft HSWA permit modification may file a petition (with respect to the issues raised in its previous comments) to the Environmental Appeals Board (EAB)¹ as provided in 40 C.F.R. § 124.19. Additionally, any person who failed to file comments on the draft HSWA permit modification may petition for administrative review only to the extent of the changes from the draft to the final permit decision. Furthermore, that section provides that a person seeking appeal must exhaust administrative appeal procedures prior to invoking judicial review.

The thirty (30) day period to request review of this final permit decision shall begin with the date of service of the Notice of Issuance. Note, for those parties receiving the Notice by mail, three (3) additional days will be added to the prescribed thirty (30) day period, as provided in 40 C.F.R. § 124.20(d).

Please note that under 40 C.F.R. § 124.19(a) any petition for review must be filed with the EAB. Any such petition must be received by the EAB on a timely basis. Petitions should be filed electronically using the EAB's electronic filing system or sent to the EAB at the following address:
