What does TSCA say about expiring CBI claims?

- The June 2016 amendments to the Toxic Substances Control Act by the Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety Act of the 21st Century, introduced new requirements relating to Confidential Business Information (CBI).
- TSCA § 14(e) limits the duration of many confidentiality claims submitted after enactment of new TSCA to 10 years, unless a request for extension is made by the submitter and approved by EPA.

Timing of expiring CBI claims

- Claims begin expiring on June 22, 2026.
 - EPA will provide notice prior to the expiration date of claims.
 - Submitters wishing to extend CBI protection must submit a request at least 30 days prior to expiration date.
 - EPA makes determination on request for extension within 30 days of request.
- 

Expiration dates and categories of Information

- **Specific Chemical Identity**
 - Under TSCA § 14(g)(4)(D), EPA must publish a list of chemical substances, for which claims to protect the specific chemical identity from disclosure have been approved, including expiration dates.
 - EPA has implemented this requirement by including expiration dates on the TSCA Inventory for confidential chemical substances.
 - CBI specific chemical identities have a **single expiration date per chemical substance**, established by the first approved CBI claim for that substance.
- **All Other Information**
 - CBI claim expiration dates for information other than specific chemical identity are set 10 years from the date the information was submitted to EPA.

Notification of Expiring Claims

- Direct notifications of expiring CBI claims will be sent via EPA's Central Data Exchange (CDX).
- EPA will also post non-CBI, public lists of submissions with expiring CBI claims on its website at www.epa.gov/TSCA-CBI.
- Expiration dates for specific chemical identities of substances on the TSCA inventory can be found at www.epa.gov/TSCA-Inventory.
- EPA expects to regularly post new lists so that companies have multiple ways to determine if claims are approaching expiration.

Requesting Extensions

- EPA has built a new reporting application in the Chemical Information Submission System (CISS) in CDX.
- EPA is working to streamline the request for extension process as much as possible.
- Authorized officials other than those who made the original submission will be able to request extensions of expiring CBI claims.
- A demonstration of the reporting application will be presented in the second half of this presentation.

Other Important Considerations

- This is not a one-time activity! Claims will be expiring on an ongoing basis starting in June 2026.
- There is no 25% representative subset provision like applies to 90 day initial CBI reviews – all requests for extension must be reviewed by EPA.
- If no request for extension is received by the expiration, the CBI claims for the information will be considered expired without further notice to the submitter.
- If EPA does not provide timely notice of an expiring claim or if EPA does not timely complete review of an extension request, EPA will not release the claimed information until the notice and any applicable review requirements are met.

What can companies do now to prepare?

- Companies should review their records to determine which of their TSCA submissions and chemical substances have CBI claims that are approaching expiration and evaluating whether to request an extension of CBI protection.
- Monitor OPPT's TSCA CBI web pages at www.epa.gov/TSCA-CBI for additional information.
- Subscribe to OPPT's listserv (enter your email in the "Sign up for TSCA and Other Chemical Safety News" on the right side of OPPT web pages).

What can companies do now to prepare?

- Do NOT send EPA general communications or amend your original submissions attempting to extend your CBI claims. Please wait for notification of expiring claims and for the new CDX application for requesting extensions of CBI claims to be available.
- Make sure contact information is up to date on TSCA submissions in CDX.
- Read the [January 6, 2026, Federal Register Notice](#) (91 Fed. Reg. 371).

The TSCA Section 14(e) CBI Claim Extension Request application supports submissions requesting extension for protection of non-exempt confidential business information (CBI). Pursuant to the Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act, which amended the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), non-exempt confidential business information (CBI) claims expire no later than 10 years after their submission. This 10-year period may be extended in accordance with TSCA section 14(e)(2)(B). To extend an expiring CBI claim, an entity must submit a request for extension substantiating the need to extend the CBI protection via the TSCA Section 14(e) CBI Claim Extension Request application.





