Section 8-13-100(31)

Section 8-13-100(31) defines “State board, commission, or council... [as] an agency created by legislation which has statewide jurisdiction and which exercises some of the sovereign power of the State.”

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Section 8-13-700(A) and (B)

Section 8-13-700(A) provides in part that "[n]o public official, public member, or public employee may knowingly use his official office, membership, or employment to obtain an economic interest for himself, a member of his immediate family, an individual with whom he is associated, or a business with which he is associated."

Section 8-13-700(B) provides in part that "[n]o public official, public member, or public employee may make, participate in making, or in any way attempt to use his official office, membership, or employment to influence a governmental decision in which he, a member of his immediate family, an individual with whom he is associated, or a business with which he is associated has an economic interest."

Section 8-13-700(B)(1)-(5) provides for disclosure of any conflicts of interest by public official, public members or public employee, which meets the requirement of CAA Section 128(a)(2) that "any potential conflicts of interest . . . be adequately disclosed."

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Section 8- 13-730

Section 8- 13-730 provides that "[u]nless otherwise provided by law, no person may serve as a member of a governmental regulatory agency that regulates any business with which that person is associated."

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
