

Appendix B

Status of the Species and Critical Habitat

The Status of the Species and Critical Habitat accounts in this appendix were initially collected by consultants and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service staff between 2014 and 2017 and were updated most recently in 2025 for use in national pesticide consultations, though they were created in a manner to be used for any consultation. Listed and proposed species and their critical habitats current as of August 1, 2025, and covered in this biological opinion, should have a Status of the Species and Critical Habitat account. The accounts represent point-in-time information, predominantly from publicly available data, and typically from U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service listing decisions, recovery plans, 5-year status reviews, species status assessments, etc.

Animal taxa are divided into the following categories:

- Amphibians
- Birds
- Crustaceans
- Fishes
- Insects
- Mammals
- Mollusks
- Reptiles

Plant taxa are divided into the following categories:

- Dicots
- Monocots
- Miscellaneous – lichens, mosses, conifers and cycads
